YOUTH ENCINITAS CAMP FAQ'S

We want camp to be a safe, enjoyable environment for your students to encounter Jesus. Please review these frequently asked questions and let us know if we can help clarify.

What is camp?

Camp is a weekend or sometimes week-long curated experience for your student to encounter Jesus. Different camps differ in how their daily program runs. Typically, you can expect your student to experience a youth group environment over the course of a few days. The hosts will be in charge of coordinating worship teams, guest speakers, ministry times and recreational activities.

Who will be at Summer Camp 2024?

We will be attending camp with our Foursquare denomination. Chances are if you've been to camp with us in the past you may see familiar faces. Us, and a few other youth groups from our region will be in attendance, including our friends at LightHouse youth from Camarillo, CA.

Is my Junior Higher too young to attend camp?

Camp can be a really stimulating environment. It may even be your students first night away from home. We believe that all ages can enjoy all that camp has to offer. All the youth groups joining us will be inviting *BOTH* their junior high and high school students. The reality is that we don't know who will sign up and what the majority age will be. However, our youth group is majority junior high and early high school so we will stick together!

What's the schedule?

Your student can expect breakfast to be served in the cafeteria first thing in the morning. Followed by a brief morning devotional/session. After that, we will play recreational games. Lunch will again be served in the cafeteria. Following lunch students will have free time until dinner. After dinner, we will have a main session with worship, message and ministry response. Some nights at camp have an after party bonfire/event following the main session. Lights out happens at the same time each night.

What is covered in the cost?

The cost of camp covers the fee paid to the camp grounds, camp materials, game supplies, transportation costs and three meals a day.

What isn't covered?

The camp cost does not include access to the snack shack. Spending money is not required but encouraged to participate in some activities. Free activities will also be provided during free times.

Camp Transportation?

Students will be shuttled to and from camp by our qualified and insured Youth Encinitas leaders. Selected leaders will need to provide a current drivers license and car insurance. In addition, parents will need to sign a camp transportation liability waiver before leaving the church.

What should I bring?

- DO Bring
 - Backpack or medium-sized duffle bag or suitcase for all belongings. Items must fit underneath bunk beds at camp; excessive packing is not feasible for the cleanliness and space of the camp facility
 - Bible, notebook and pen/pencil for the week's activities (a few, these always go missing)
 - Weather appropriate clothing ie. thick jacket, athletic shoes
 - o Towels, bedding, and personal hygiene items
 - Optional money for special offerings and snacks.
 - Students are allowed to bring their cell phones however it is encouraged that they are on it minimally to avoids unnecessary distractions
 - Campground will not be responsible for stolen or damaged items brought to camp.
- DO NOT Bring
 - No weapons, fireworks, tobacco, alcohol, or illegal drugs
 - Video games or other electronics
 - No skateboards, roller skates, or roller blades
